Renewal Notices

The Bible is full of amazing stories of God sending out renewal notices, inviting people to change, and we have two examples this morning in our readings from the book of Jonah and in Marks Gospel.

In the book of Jonah, we see the reluctant prophet was God's renewal notice to the city of Nineveh. After initially refusing to obey God, he finally obeys and, in the end, the people listened, repented and were saved.

In Marks Gospel we see Jesus beginning his ministry by inviting the fisherman to partner with Him in proclaiming: *The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news. (Mark1:15).*

Just as God sent the city of Nineveh a renewal notice through the prophet Jonah, and just as Jesus called the fishermen to follow him in spreading the word about God's offer of renewal, so Jesus also comes to us this morning inviting us to accept the spiritual renewal he offers.

This invitation can come to us in various ways. God is very creative in the ways He communicates with us, and He can easily get our attention providing we are listening to Him.

Jonah could have decided to disobey God's word. But he didn't. The fishermen could have ignored Jesus' call to them. But they didn't. Thankfully they listened and obediently followed God's instructions and lives were changed, people saved.

The same applies to us. God calls us into an ever-deepening relationship with Himself.

So, have you heard God's call to you?

And when you do, will you answer?
