

#### Be Fruitful

As we know pruning trees aids healthy growth and the fruiting process. So, it is no wonder that Jesus used this analogy to talk about the process of discipleship.

Fruitful branches are cut back to promote growth.

The unfruitful branches are cut off because not only are they worthless, but they can often infect the rest of the tree.

Our discipleship is based on our attachment to the vine (Jesus), and our fruit bearing is directly related to Him.

It is the vine that gives life to the branch. Nourishment from the vine enables the branch to bear good fruit.

This means that when we abide in Jesus, and stay connected to him, he will cultivate our lives so that we produce much fruit for him.

We find some of these fruits listed in Galatians 5:

Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, Selfcontrol.

When we are connected to Jesus, He brings us quietly but surely to spiritual maturity, producing the fruit that we were designed to bear.

So, we don't have to stress and strain about our character or the fruit our life is producing.

We need to make sure we are 'abiding in Jesus' and allowing the Holy Spirit to produce the fruit that comes from his presence within us.

So, the questions for reflection this week are:

Are you abiding in Christ?

What sort of fruit is your life producing? What sort of fruit is this church known for?
